Selected accomplishments:

- Created and taught for 6 years a 24-hour lecture series for Johns Hopkins University faculty, fellows, and research staff on designing randomized and observational comparative effectiveness studies, including studies that involve survival analysis, longitudinal analysis, multilevel (hierarchical) models, cost-effectiveness analysis, and propensity score methods.
- Completed longitudinal analyses of the effectiveness of a skin care device and a topical treatment using generalized estimating equations and linear mixed models, programmed in R, for a consumer products company.
- Created a Markov chain Monte Carlo method (Gibbs sampler), programmed in SAS Interactive Matrix Language (IML) and SAS Macro Language, that fits a multilevel (hierarchical) multivariate model for analysis of health care providers' effects on multiple related outcomes (i.e., multivariate provider profiling).
- Created a machine learning program for predictive modeling of patients' health care costs based on ICD diagnoses and demographic data, via stochastic gradient boosting (boosted regression trees), coded in SAS Interactive Matrix Language (IML) and SAS Macro Language.
- Developed a longitudinal model, fitted using generalized estimating equations (GEE), for predicting monthly health care cost for patients with heart failure enrolled in a disease management program.
- Created a procedure for multivariate analysis of healthcare operations efficiency using data envelopment analysis models, optimized via linear programming written in R language, with an interactive graphical output interface.
- Designed and developed protocols for evaluating the integrity and validity of large-scale electronic health records and claims databases, using SQL (Microsoft and Amazon cloud), SAS, and R language programming.
- Created a procedure for extracting selected data elements directly from electronic data interchange (EDI) health care claims into a relational database, using SQL and C language programming.
- Designed and developed procedures for transforming administrative data coded in terms of ICD, CPT, HCPCS, LOINC, and national drug codes into measures of appropriate care of diabetes, hypertension, heart disease, chronic kidney disease, COPD, and asthma, consistent with established clinical practice guidelines.
